 - \$2,019,564 in scholarship funds awarded since 2018

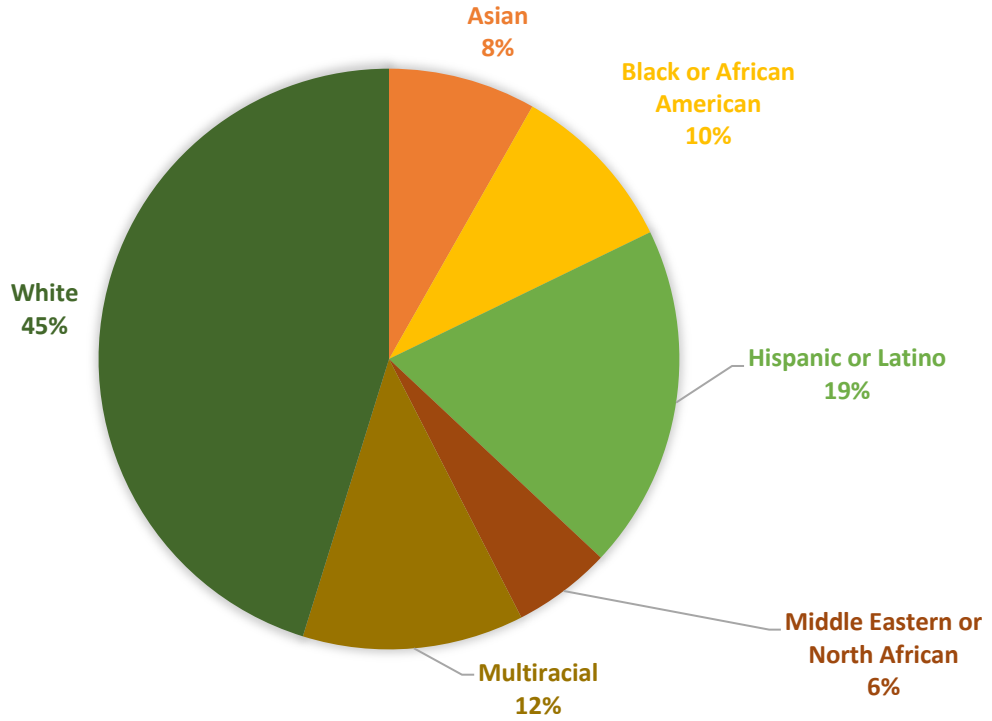

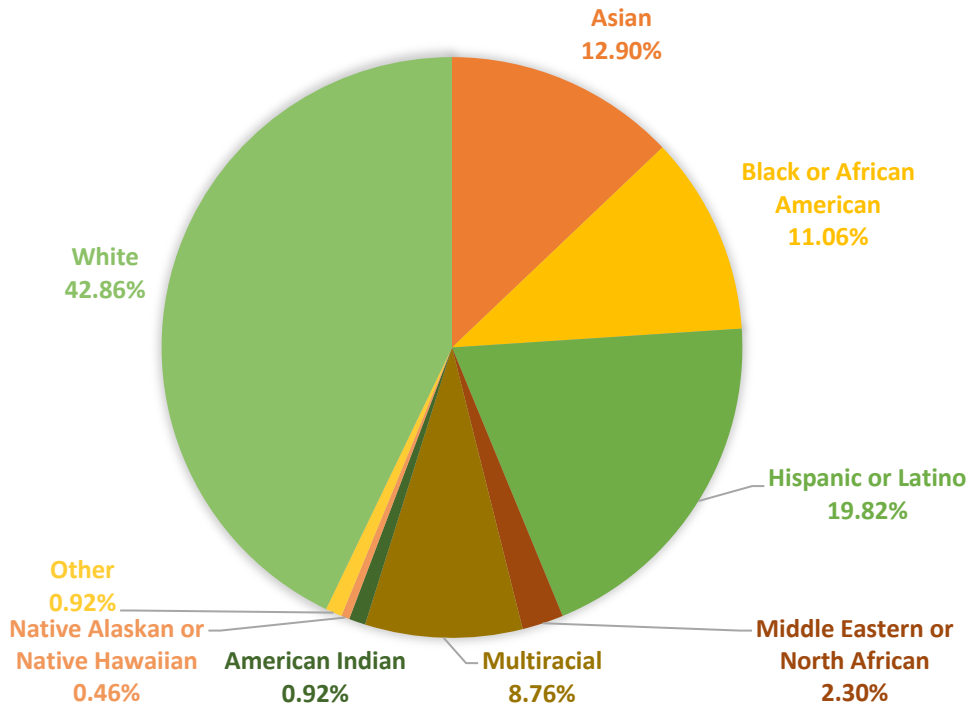

2018-2022 Survey Results

- 92% said the Academy improved their opinion of people with different backgrounds and perspectives than their own.
- 76% of students are more interested in civic, political or government affairs.
- 86% said NHA did a better job of tying foundational historic events to current issues more effectively than their previous coursework.
- 90% felt more confident after attending NHA.
